



HAVE YOUR SAY! PROPOSED PERMANENT FULL AND PARTIAL ROAD CLOSURES

Notice is hereby given in terms of section 4 of the City of Cape Town Immovable Property By-law 2015, that the City of Cape Town's Urban Mobility Directorate intends the permanent full or partial closure of certain roads to vehicular traffic in the Claremont area.

Residents are reminded that the City previously approved the concept design of trunk routes and station locations for Phase 2A, which will provide safe, quality, rapid and direct MyCiTi services linking Khayelitsha and Mitchells Plain with Wynberg and Claremont.

As part of the detailed design phase now underway, some roads are identified to be either fully or partially closed to vehicular traffic to provide for stations, intersection improvements, upgrades to walking and cycling facilities, and dedicated public transport lanes, and to improve safety for all road users.

Intersection of Imam Haron Road and Columbus Road	Partial	No right turn from Columbus Road into Imam Haron Road.	Right turn access via new signalised intersection at Markham and Chichester roads.	W1006/2022
Intersection of Chichester Road and Markham Road	One-way	Markham Road between Imam Haron Road and Chichester Road will become a one-way in the direction toward Chichester Road.	Access available to Imam Haron Road from Franklin Road.	W1007/2022
Intersection of Chichester Road and Selous Road	Full closure	No direct access between Selous Road and Chichester Road due to proximity to signalised intersection of Belvedere and Chichester roads.	Access available via Belvedere Road.	W1008/2022
Intersection of Chichester Road and Loch Road	Median closure	Left turning only. No right turns from/into Loch Road due to median bus lane.	Right turn access at Garfield Road or Belvedere Road intersections.	W1009/2022
Intersection of Loch Road and Garfield Road	Partial closure	No right turn into Garfield Road from Loch Road.	Access via Doncaster Road.	W1010/2022
Intersection of Imam Haron Road and First Avenue	Median closure	Left turning only. No right turns from/into First Avenue due to median bus lane.	Right turn access at new signalised intersections at Ravensworth Road or Second Avenue.	W1011/2022
Intersection of Chichester Road and Franklin Road	Median closure	Left turning only. No right turns from/into Franklin Road due to median bus lane.	Right turn access at new signalised intersection at Markham Road or Belvedere Road.	W1012/2022
